

Individual dots represent the average student response for each affiliate faculty member teaching in one or more didactic PharmD, Masters and graduate courses at the School of Pharmacy during the Fall 2015 courses for the question, "This instructor taught the material in a way that was conducive to learning". The red bar labelled "AVERAGE" represents the overall average for all instructors teaching in the same semester. The grey shaded area represents an error bar of ±5% based on the mean.

The table below represents the number of Likert-scale responses for each course in which you taught. It is the basis for calculation of the dots and red line shown above. Key: SA=Strongly Agree (4), A=Agree (3), D=Disagree (2), SD=Strongly Disagree (1), UC=Unable to Comment (ignored in calculation). Total=total student responses to this question. Your Avg=your average in this course, for the instructor question on a 4-point Likert-scale. Course Avg=the average for all faculty teaching in this course, for the instructor question on a 4-point Likert-scale.

Please refer to the graph above to locate your average on the curve; note that the graph does not reflect course averages.
